Holy Listening is a Launde Abbey training course which will help you develop skills and reflective practice for a ministry of spiritual direction. We explore core aspects of Christian spirituality, and how we create and hold spaces that enable other people to hear God speaking in their lives.

Each course day we begin with prayer and reflection introducing a variety of different aspects of prayer and Christian spirituality. The main seminar of the day covers various topics associated with spiritual direction.

During the afternoon we engage in practice sessions to embed our learning. You'll be asked to share and work with your own concerns and experiences throughout the course, and a willingness to do this is essential.

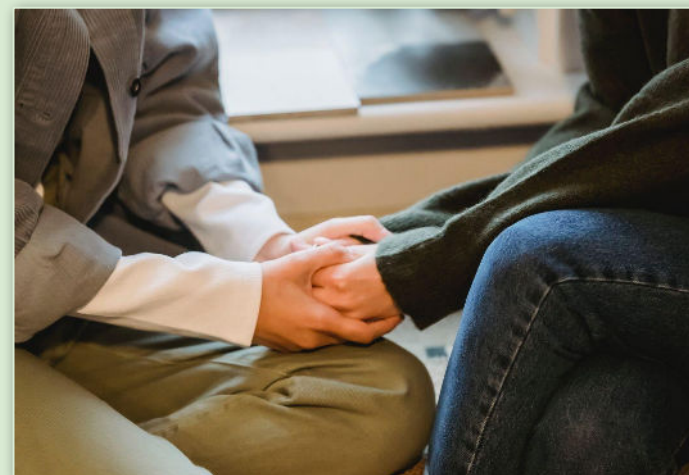
You'll also keep a reflective journal throughout the course, complete some written assignments, and meet from time to time with one of the tutors.

Admissions

Applying to be part of *Holy Listening* is the beginning of a discernment process that continues throughout the course.

An application form is available on the website and should be returned to Janet Brown (hl@launde.org.uk) by Friday 19th September. Ten places are available, with enrolment open to both clergy and lay Christians.

Interviews will be held at Launde Abbey on 13th, 14th and 15th October to assess how appropriate the course may be for you, and to discern the likelihood of this being a part of your future ministry.

We'll notify successful candidates by 31st October.

Fees and Bursaries

The annual fee for the 2026–27 intake is £1860, including a non-refundable deposit of £310 payable on course commencement and offset against the final semester fees. This includes all tuition, materials, meals, and the cost of the residentials.

The fees may be paid by a Direct Debit of £155 per month.

Launde Abbey has been the home of *Holy Listening* since the first course began here in 2013.

Set in the spacious east Leicestershire countryside, Launde has been a place of prayer for nine centuries and an Anglican retreat house for over seventy years.

During the course you'll enjoy the warm hospitality (and great food!) for which Launde is renowned. You'll also share in the praying life of the community and have access to the Chapels, labyrinths, prayer rooms and other facilities of the retreat house.

Your Sponsoring Community

Every student on the Holy Listening course is required to have a sponsoring church or community. This sponsor may be:

- your local church
- a denominational body
- a training institute at which you are studying
- a Christian organisation for which you work
- a monastic or religious community

or any other suitable organisation able to fulfil the sponsorship requirements

If you're considering applying for a place on Holy Listening you'll want to begin conversations with your potential sponsoring community as soon as possible so they have time for any formal processes to take place.

We ask sponsoring communities to do five things in support of your application, training, and future ministry (helping you to **PRESS** forward!) ...

PRAY for you during your discernment about the course, your time of training, and as you enter into your new ministry

RECOMMEND you formally for training and future ministry (this would usually involve a minuted agreement at a formal meeting – a church council, chapter meeting or meeting of trustees, for example)

ENSURE you are able to meet all the safeguarding requirements for this ministry (this includes running a DBS check on your behalf and providing access to relevant safeguarding training)

SUSTAIN you during your period of training (this includes pastoral and spiritual care, and helping you find your first directee for the second year of the course; they may also choose to offer financial aid, although this is not required to be a sponsor)

SUPPORT your transition into ministry after the course (which may include ensuring you are able to connect with peer networks and find a supervisor)
